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Curriculum Letter YEAR 5 AUTUMN 2

Dear Parents / Carers,

We would first of all like to welcome you and your child back to school after a busy and eventful first half term. We hope that you have had a restful break and are ready for this term's learning. Please find below the units that your child will be learning this term as well as some important information and upcoming events.

Writing: Narrative Setting Description

This term, in English, children will be reading The Curse of Cogston House. They will be focusing on the narrative of mystery and writing a setting description with a focus on creating suspense and tension.

Science

This term pupils will work on the following areas of investigating about living things and their habitats:

- I can describe the life cycle of different living things, e.g. mammal, amphibian, insect bird.
- I can describe the differences between different life cycles.
- I can describe the process of reproduction in plants.
- I can describe the process of reproduction in animals.

Music:

This term children will be watching and comparing two videos of New York City landscape. They will listen to the music in these videos and discuss how the city landscape is portrayed through composition, with a focus on a wide range of dynamic (e.g. very loud (fortissimo), very quiet (pianissimo), moderately loud (mezzo forte), and moderately quiet (mezzo piano). Pupils will then go on to experimenting and creating their own musical sounds using technology, to accompany a silent scene of New York City, using body percussion and beat boxing.

Maths

Pupils will be working on multiplication and division in this half term. The following areas will be covered:

- Multiples, factors and prime numbers
- Formal methods for multiplication and division
- Reasoning and problem-solving involving perimeter for rectilinear shapes.
- · Adding and subtracting fractions
- Multiplying and dividing fractions

MFL - Arabic

<u>HOBBIES</u>: This term's theme will include pupils learning how to say different hobbies whilst expressing what their hobbies are and the reasons why. Particular focus will be on ensuring gender words and pronouns correspond correctly in the sentences. They will also read a variety of short texts in order to grasp an understanding of the texts and will attempt to write a short paragraph about the topic.

RE

In Year Five, we will understand how faith helps us to cope with matters of life and death. We will learn about the journey of the soul and the Akhirah (Hereafter). We will explore the importance of A'araf and the concept of Al-Mizaan (The scale of deeds).

PE

Sports Coach: Football In this unit pupils develop their understanding of the attacking and defending principles of invasion game. Pupils have to think about how they use skills, strategies and tactics to outwit the opposition. In football pupils do this by maintaining possession and moving the ball towards goal to score.

Class Teacher:

In this unit pupils develop balancing, rolling, jumping and inverted movements. They explore partner relationships such as canon and synchronisation and matching and mirroring.

Art and DT

<u>Children will be</u> looking at Pop Art and the focus artist –Andy Wahol, and creating their own pop art. They will improve their mastery of art and design techniques with a range of materials.



















Computing

This term children will find out that vector images are made up of shapes. They will learn how to use the different drawing tools and how images are created in layers. They will explore the ways in which images can be grouped and duplicated to support them in creating more complex pieces of work.

PE Kit

Please find below the days that each class will have PE:
