CURRICULUM NEWSLETTER YEAR 2- AUTUMN TERM 2023

Writing

This term Writing and History has been combined to create a cross curricular link. Text types: character description and diary entry

 Grammar focus: As well as using capital letters and full stops to punctuate a sentence, children will also be introduced to a range of other punctuation in order to up level their writing.

Reading

Focus text: Beowulf by Michael Morpurgo.
In reading children will be covering a variety of reading skills and test style questions in preparation for their end of term assessments.

A few of the skills the children will be exposed to this term are:

- Sequencing and summarising events
- Inferring
- Comparing and contrasting
- Understanding meaning of words

Science

Electricity

- To talk about common appliances that run on electricity
- To construct and draw an electrical circuit
- To predict whether a lamp will light or not.
- To explain that a switch opens and closes a circuit.
- To know which materials are conductors or insulators.

Music Singing

In this unit of work children will learn to sing <u>Ya Nabi</u> <u>Ya Nabi</u>. They will listen to and analyse songs, discussing the messages portrayed through the lyrics. Identify the varying dynamics presented in the song (Crescendo/ Decrescendo) and imitate to sing at the same pitch and variation.

Children will have the opportunity to perform their singing in the end of term assembly.

Maths

Place value

- Read, write, order and compare numbers to 1000 and beyond.
- To find 1000 more/less than a given number.
- Identify and represent numbers using objects.
- Count in multiples of 6,7,9,25 and 1000-forwards and backwards
- Use a number square and number line to count forwards and backwards- including negative numbers.
- Understand place value what each digit in a number means.
- Addition and subtraction 4 digit numbers.
- To solve problems using abstract and practical methods.
- To recall multiplication and division facts up to 12x12.

MFL - Arabic

My Home

Autumn term will begin with Year 4 covering the topic 'My Home'.

They will learn the vocabulary for different types of dwellings and the rooms within those dwellings.

Pupils will also be taught how to use Arabic dictionaries to look for words related to the vocabulary of the topic.

Thereafter, pupils will make sentences describing the homes and rooms using adjectives whilst applying the rules of grammar linked to the use of adjectives.

<u>R.E</u> Key Beliefs

The children will learn the story of Dawud AS and Jalut. They will explore famous landmarks of Masjid Al Aqsa and its importance in Islam.

Thereafter they will learn about Prophet Sulaiman AS and his miracles.

















Focus 1 this Term - Football

Character Values - Co- operating, Determination

Football is an invasion game. In this unit pupils develop their understanding of the attacking and defending principles of invasion games. In all games activities, pupils have to think about how they use skills, strategies and tactics to outwit the opposition. In football pupils do this by maintaining possession and moving the ball towards goal to score. Pupils develop their understanding of the importance of fair play and honesty while self-managing games and learning and abiding by key rules, as well as evaluating their own and others' performances.

Focus this Term - Tennis

Character Skill - Co-Operation, Determination

Tennis is a net and wall game. In this unit pupils develop their understanding of the principles of net and wall games. In all games activities, pupils have to think about how they use skills, strategies and tactics to outwit the opposition. Pupils are given opportunities to play games independently and are taught the importance of being honest whilst playing to the rules.

Art/DT Britain settlements by Anglo Saxons and Scots - DT – Textiles

Pupils will research the work of the Bayeux tapestry. They will be creating their own tapestry style illustrations.
