#### **YEAR 3 - AUTUMN TERM**

Dear Parents / Carers,

Please find below the units that your child will be learning this half term.

### **English**

### Writing

This term Writing and History has been combined to create a cross curricular link. Children will be writing Non-chronological reports linked to our history topic:

'Prehistoric Britain: From the Stone Age to the Iron Age'.

Reading – Stone Age Tales – The Great Flood by Terry Deary
We will also be reading a range of non-fiction texts this half
term linked to our History topic.

A few of the skills the children will be exposed to this term are:

- Sequencing and summarising events
- Inferring
- Comparing and contrasting
- Understanding meaning of words

#### Maths

- Recognise the place value of each digit in a three-digit number (hundreds, tens, ones)
- Count from 0 in multiples of 4, 8, 50 and 100; find 10 or 100 more or less than a given number
- Compare and order numbers up to 1000
- Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations
- Read and write numbers up to 1000 in numerals and in words
- Solve number problems and practical problems involving these ideas

#### Science

### **Animals Including Humans:**

- Identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amount of nutrition, and that they cannot make their own food; they get nutrition from what they eat
- Identify that humans and some other animals have skeletons and muscles for support, protection and movement.

# RE

**Key Beliefs:** The children will learn the story of Dawud AS and Jalut. They will explore famous landmarks of Masjid Al Aqsa and its importance in Islam. Thereafter, they will learn about Prophet Sulaiman AS and his miracles.

#### PE Focus 1 - Netball

# Character values - co-operating and determination

Develop their understanding of the attacking and defending principles of invasion games. Maintaining possession and moving the ball towards goal to score. Pupils develop their understanding of the importance of fair play and honesty while self-managing games and learning and abiding by key rules, as well as evaluating their own and others' performances.

# PE Focus 2 – Fundamentals & Fitness

# <u>Character Values – Responsibility & Co- Operation</u>

Develop the fundamental skills of balancing, running, jumping, hopping and skipping. Pupils will develop their ability to change direction with balance and control. Opportunity to explore how the body moves at different speeds as well as how to accelerate and decelerate.

### Art/DT

**Pre-historic Jewellery-** Children will be studying the art of jewellery making and the techniques used.

NC Objectives covered:

- Begin to show an awareness of objects having a third dimension and perspective.
- To improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials [for example, pencil, charcoal, paint, clay]
- Discuss about great artists, architects and designers in history.
- Understand the historical and cultural development of art forms (mosaics); Explore ideas to improve mastery of art and design techniques

# MFL - Arabic

**All About Me:** This term year 3 will be covering the topic 'All About Me' which will include learning sentences and phrases used to introduce oneself in Arabic. This will be followed by learning how to greet friends and ask them how they are doing. Later in the term pupils will add information about themselves by learning the colours they like whilst also learning the number 0-10.

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#### Computing

#### Computer systems and networks- Connecting computers:

- · Use sequence, selection, and repetition in programs; work with variables and various forms of input and output
- understand computer networks including the internet; how they can provide multiple services, such as the world wide web; and the opportunities they offer for communication and collaboration
- select, use and combine a variety of software (including internet services) on a range of digital devices to design and create a
  range of programs, systems and content that accomplish given goals, including collecting, analysing, evaluating and presenting
  data and information

#### Music

### This term children will be learning to sing Hasbi Rabbi.

### They will learn:

- To be aware of posture when singing and accurately maintain a pulse.
- to use rehearsals to develop musical quality e.g. clear starts, ends of pieces/ phrases, technical accuracy.

Pupils will get the opportunity to perform during the end of term assembly.

#### PF
