- Have fun** amongst their friends in a **halal and safe environment**



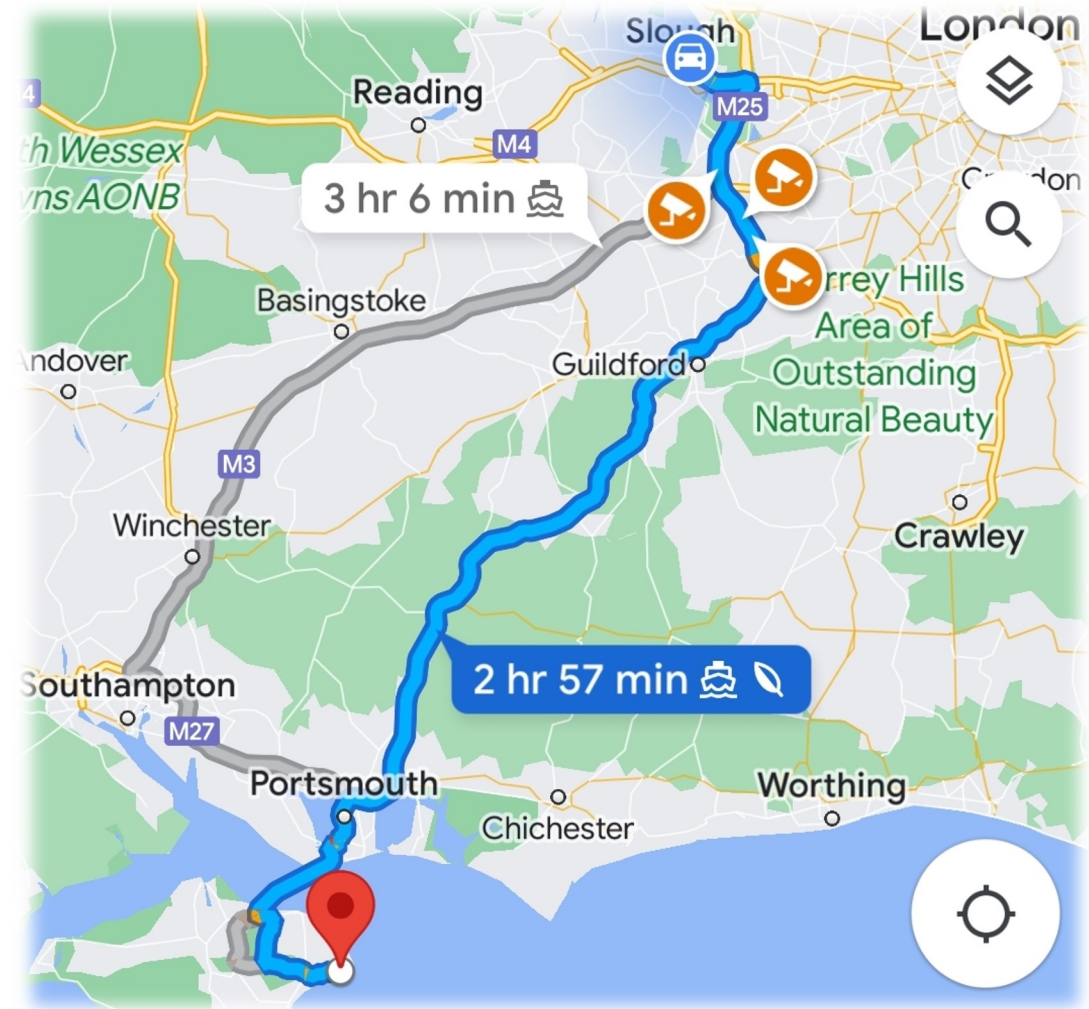
Where is Kingswood Centre ?

Children will be allowed to bring snacks for the journey which they can have during the break at the service stations.

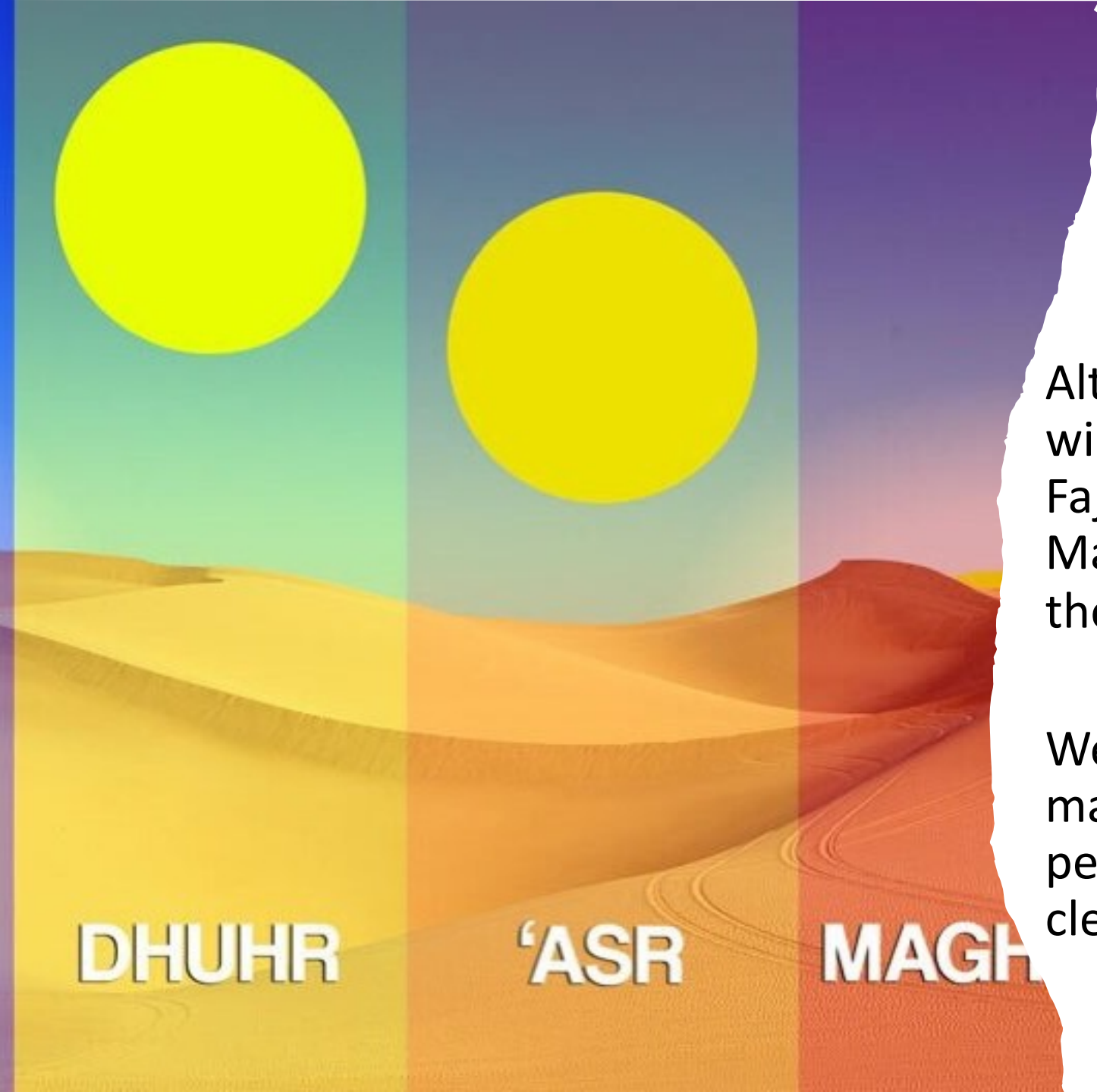
Please note: No sugary sweets/ snacks permitted.



Sleeping Arrangements

- Iqra will have exclusive access to the whole residential house. This includes dormitories, bathrooms and lounging area. **No other visitor or group will have access to the accommodation.**
- Main entrance of accommodation will be locked with an access code which teachers will know of.
- The boys dormitories are on the ground floor and located together, with a teacher in the room next door.
- All girls dormitories are on the 1st floor and located together, with 2 teachers in the rooms on opposite ends.

School Ethos

Although we are out of school, children will still get the opportunity to pray Fajr in the mornings as well as dhur, asr Maghrib and Isha before retiring to their bedrooms for the night.

Consequences of any misbehaviour

As mentioned earlier, residential trips of this nature provide children with opportunities to develop their social and personal skills. At the same time children must ensure they are on their best behaviour, representing themselves, their teachers and the school in a positive light.

Negative behaviour will be dealt with immediately by Mr Saddique, Ms Munir or Mrs Maher.

If a child misbehaves in a manner which causes danger to themselves or their peers, they will be excluded from the activity. A phone call will be made to the parents informing them of the incident. There will be consequences for the child once returned to school.

This trip is an opportunity for children to have fun and enjoy themselves in a safe environment away from school and home. Therefore we would encourage everyone to make the right choices based on the **schools core values** and take this opportunity to display the **learning behaviours** positively.

Essential equipment and materials to bring

- Waterproof jacket – possibility of rain and/or water activities.

- Footwear – 2 pairs of trainers (1 rough pair for the day and one neat pair for the evenings)
- Casual jeans/tracksuits (full sleeves) suitable for outdoor activities. (3 pairs)
- Jumpers for evening wear if it gets cold.
- Caps/Sun hat for hot weather – sun cream
- Night wear/clothing – pyjamas.
- Change of under garments and 2/3 pairs of socks.
- 1 bath Towel
- Plastic bag for wet/dirty clothes
- Essential toiletries – toothbrush/toothpaste/shower gel/comb
- Refillable water bottle
